2. Patron: Hayes

3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Court-established community service programs; community service work in lieu of payment of fine.

5. Summary: Requires courts to provide an option for discharging all or part of fines or costs imposed on any person by earning credits for performing community service work before or after imprisonment. Under current law, providing this option is discretionary.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8 below.

8. Fiscal Implications: Revenue from fines is deposited into the Literary Fund and revenue from court costs is deposited into the general fund and various special funds. The opportunity for offenders to earn credits by performing community service in lieu of partial payment or payment in full may reduce the amount of revenue available to these funds. However, it is not possible to project how many offenders would choose the community service credit option or to estimate the amount of credits that would be ultimately be earned. Therefore, it is not possible to estimate the potential reduction in revenue.
