3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: School safety procedures; emergency situations, annual training.

5. Summary: Requires each school board to develop training on safety procedures in the event of an emergency situation on school property. The bill requires such training to be delivered to each student and employee in each school at least once each school year. In addition, the Board of Education shall develop guidelines for the development and delivery of training required by this act.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: Any costs to localities in implementing the requirements of this legislation are indeterminate at this time. It is anticipated that the Board of Education and Department of Education can absorb any costs related to developing guidelines for the development and delivery of training required by this act.
