**4. Title:** Riparian planting ground; assignment eligibility.

**5. Summary:** Reduces from 205 feet to 105 feet the minimum low-water shore front that makes a landowner eligible to apply for riparian planting grounds assignment by the Commissioner of the Marine Resources Commission. The bill provides that in the Lynnhaven River and its tributaries, the Commissioner shall assign to such land owner only a riparian planting ground that the Commissioner, in his discretion, deems appropriate to encompass as much as one-half acre of ground.
