4. Title: Virginia Land Conservation Foundation; project proposals.

5. Summary: Directs the Virginia Land Conservation Foundation (the Foundation) to conduct a grant round each year to identify and rank projects for the subsequent fiscal year. The bill requires the Foundation to assume an amount of funding of the grant program as provided in the general appropriation act. The bill requires the Foundation to provide rankings to the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance by December 15 of each year.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill requires the Virginia Land Conservation Foundation to conduct a grant round each year to identify and rank projects for the subsequent fiscal year. The bill requires that the list be submitted to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance on or before December 15 of each year. The Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) staffs the Board. According to DCR, a 1500 hour wage position will be required to accomplish this effort, as existing staff cannot absorb the additional workload. It is anticipated that the cost of the wage position would total approximately \$57,401 including operating expenses. Section 10.1-1020, Code of Virginia, which establishes the Virginia Land Conservation Fund, specifies that up to \$250,000 per year in interest generated by the Fund may be used for the Foundation's administrative expenses. It is anticipated that the hourly wage position would be supported through this interest. If additional spending authority is required to support this wage position

in the current biennium, appropriation can be provided administratively as authorized in Section 4-1.04 of the Appropriation Act.
