4. Title: Background checks for persons providing care for the elderly or disabled

5. Summary: Allows any person who provides or seeks to provide unsupervised care or assistance to an elderly or disabled person may request the Department of State Police to conduct a national criminal background check on the person at his or her own cost.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of State Police (VSP) performs both legally required and elective background checks on individuals seeking employment in various fields. This bill would allow individuals already employed or seeking employment for the unsupervised care of elderly or disabled persons to voluntarily submit to a background check at their own cost. According to VSP, there is no anticipated fiscal impact on its operations as a result of this proposed legislation.
