2. Patron: Guzman

3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Smoking in motor vehicle with a minor present.

5. Summary: Expands the age group of minors in the presence of whom it is illegal to smoke in a motor vehicle from those under the age of eight to those under the age of 16. The bill expands the definition of "smoke" to include use of a nicotine vapor product. A violation of this section is punishable by a civil penalty of \$100.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: Although this legislation could result in increased civil penalty revenues due to potentially more violations, it is impossible to determine the extent of the impact at this time. Any revenue derived from this legislation will be deposited into the Literary Fund.
