**4. Title:** Virginia Department of Emergency Management; annual reporting requirements.

**5. Summary:** The engrossed bill reassigns certain reporting requirements of the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security and the Secure and Resilient Commonwealth Panel to the Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM). The bill combines these with other annual reports required of VDEM and consolidates them into one tabulated report titled the “Virginia Comprehensive Emergency Management Report.”

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The engrossed legislation would combine the annual Commonwealth Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (C-THIRA) report with other annual reports required by law into one comprehensive report, which VDEM would submit to the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security and the Chairmen of the Senate Committee on Finance, the Senate Committee for Courts of Justice, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the House Committee on Militia, Police and Public Safety by November 1 of each year.

According to VDEM, this bill would not have an impact on agency operations.
