**4. Title:** Delivery Permits

**5. Summary:** The proposed bill requires delivery permittees to keep records for a period of at least 2 years. The bill stipulates the records should include the brands of wine and beer sold and the signatures of the purchasers to whom the wine and beer is delivered. Such purchaser signatures may be in an electronic format. Permittees are required to remit such records on a monthly basis for any month during which the permittee makes a delivery for which the permittee is required to collect and remit taxes due to the Commonwealth pursuant to subsection D of § 4.1-212.1.
