3. Committee: House Committee on Education

4. Title: School resource officer training.

5. Summary: Requires the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety (the Center) to provide training to each school resource officer employed by a local law-enforcement agency before such officer begins his assignment in a public elementary or secondary school, unless the Center lacks the capacity to provide training for each such officer or other circumstances exist that prevent any such officer from completing such training. The bill requires the Center to encourage administrators who are employed at a school to which a school resource officer is assigned to attend such training with such school resource officer.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No. Item 392 of the introduced budget bill (HB1700/SB1100) includes an appropriation to support this legislation.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary (see Item 8 below).

8. Fiscal Implications: Currently, the Department of Criminal Justice Services provides training to school resource officers that are supported by state grant funding. The Governor's introduced budget (HB1700/SB1100) provides one position and \$427,630 to enable the agency to provide basic training to every school resource officer as mandated by the proposed legislation.
