**4. Title:** Capital murder of law enforcement officers or fire marshals

**5. Summary:** The proposed bill provides that no person charged with capital murder of a law-enforcement officer, a fire marshal or deputy or assistant fire marshal when such fire marshal or deputy or assistant fire marshal has been granted police powers, an auxiliary police officer, an auxiliary deputy sheriff, or any law-enforcement officer of another state or the United States having the power to arrest for a felony under the laws of such state or the United States shall have his capital murder charge reduced or amended in any manner.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed bill would prohibit any amendment or reduction of a capital murder charge for an offender who murders a law enforcement officer or fire marshal.
