4. Title: Tax-exempt pollution control facilities; certifying authority; Virginia Department of Health

5. Summary: Adds to the duties of the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) the duty of serving as a state certifying authority for pollution control equipment and facilities certified by the Department, this exemption applies only to onsite sewage systems that serve 10 or more households, use nitrogen-reducing processes and technology, and are constructed, wholly or partially, with public funds. All such property as described in this definition shall not include the land on which such equipment or facilities are located. Under current law, the State Water Control Board is the only state certifying authority for water pollution projects.

7. No Fiscal Impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. The Department of Taxation has indicated that the bill does not increase the types of certified pollution control facilities or expand the criteria for the current types of certified pollution control facilities and therefore would not have a revenue impact for adding VDH as a state certifying authority.
