**4. Title:** Child-care services and facilities; regulation in certain counties.

**5. Summary:** Requires the zoning administrator in a locality to issue a permit for a family day home, unless a written objection is received within 30 days after each adjacent property owner is notified. Further requires the zoning administrator to consider an objection and may issue or deny permit, or refer the permit to the local governing body for consideration.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This legislation does not have a fiscal impact. Cities and counties are responsible for determining their own ordinances for zoning of family day homes serving five through 12 children, exclusive of the provider's children and any children that reside in the home.
