4. Title: Office of the Attorney General; representation of members of the General Assembly for violations.

5. Summary: Allows the Office of the Attorney General to represent a member of the General Assembly in any civil matter alleging that such member in his official capacity violated the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.). This bill is a recommendation of the Virginia Freedom of Information Advisory Council.

8. Fiscal Implications: The engrossed version of the bill includes a clause that “the provisions of this act shall not become effective unless an appropriation effectuating the purposes of this act is included in a general appropriation act passed in 2019 by the General Assembly that becomes law.” This bill will have a fiscal impact for the Attorney General and Department of Law (OAG). The OAG indicates that this bill will require the addition of 1 senior attorney, 1 junior attorney, and 1 paralegal staff, costing \$439,401 per year.
