**4. Title:** Tinting films exemption for security canine handlers

**5. Summary:** Exempts vehicles operated in the performance of private security duties by a security canine handler from limitations on window tinting. Currently, no sun-shading or tinting films may be applied to any vehicle in the Commonwealth that reduces light transmittance to the rear side or rear windows by less than 35 percent, or to the front side windows by less than 50 percent. Additionally, no sun-shading or tinting may be applied to any window if it has a reflectance of light exceeding 20 percent or produces a holographic or prism effect. These provisions exclude any regulated decals or stickers approved by the Superintendent of State Police. Currently, all windows on law enforcement vehicles, sight-seeing carriers, contract passenger carriers, and the rear or rear side windows of emergency medical services vehicles are excluded from these requirements.
