**4. Title:** Development and review of school crisis, emergency management, and medical emergency response plan

**5. Summary:** Requires each school board to include the chief law-enforcement officer, the fire chief, the chief of the emergency medical services agency, the emergency management official of the locality and the executive director of the relevant regional emergency medical services council, or their designees, in the development and review of school crisis, emergency management, and medical emergency response plans. Under current law, the school board is required to provide copies of such plans to the chief law-enforcement officer, the fire chief, the chief of the emergency medical services agency, and the emergency management official of the locality but is not required to include such first responders in the development and review of such plans.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** There is no anticipated state fiscal impact resulting from the provisions of this bill. Any impact to localities is indeterminate at this time.
