4. Title: Department of Education to annually collect data on programs.

5. Summary: Requires the Department of Education to annually collect from each school board and publish on its website various enrollment and achievement data on alternative education programs for students who have been suspended, expelled, or otherwise precluded from attendance at school. The bill requires such data to be published in a manner that protects the identities of individual students and disaggregated by local school division and by student race, ethnicity, gender, and disability.

8. Fiscal Implications: To satisfy the requirements of this bill, Department of Education (DOE) staff would need to create a data collection, database, and online reporting format, which would involve several months of staff time working with school divisions. This staff support also would be responsible for training school divisions to submit data and to administer the data collection. Support for the data collection would be ongoing. DOE also notes additional administration for the Office of Student Support to provide program support to school divisions, which would involve training and technical assistance; this service does not currently exist within DOE. Programmatic support for school divisions would be ongoing. DOE estimates an additional state cost of \$55,000 per year to support a wage position to satisfy the requirements of this bill.
