Summary: Requires a health carrier offering or providing a health benefit plan, including (i) short-term and catastrophic health insurance policies, and policies that pay on a cost-incurred basis; (ii) association health plans; (iii) plans provided by a multiple-employer welfare arrangement; (iv) plans provided pursuant to a benefits consortium, the members of which are banks and employers that provide products and services to banks; and (v) plans provided pursuant to a not-for-profit benefits consortium consisting of five or more private educational institutions, to provide, as an essential health benefit, coverage that includes preventive care. Essential health benefits include items and services covered in accordance with regulations issued pursuant to the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act in effect as of January 1, 2019.

Technical amendment necessary:** Senate Bill 1344 seeks to require essential health benefits to be included in health benefit plans offered by, among other entities, benefits consortiums regulated in accordance with § 6.2-953 and subsection D of § 23.1-106, both of which are not subject to the provisions of Title 38.2. The State Corporation Commission Bureau of Insurance has advised the patron of Senate Bill 1344 that this conflict should be addressed if it is her intention that these consortia regulated in other titles are to offer essential health benefits.
