**4. Title:** Child abuse or neglect; appeals from founded complaints, concurrent criminal investigations.

**5. Summary:** Provides that whenever an appeal of a finding by a local department of social services is made and a criminal investigation is also commenced against the appellant for the same conduct involving the same victim as investigated by the local department, the appeal process shall automatically be stayed until the criminal investigation is closed or, in the case of a criminal investigation that is not completed within 180 days of the appellant's request for an appeal, for 180 days.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** None.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This legislation changes the time frame within which the local department of social services staff is required to act in the administrative appeals process. The responsibilities of the local staff do not change; therefore, this bill has no fiscal impact.
