4. Title: Reports to Central Criminal Records Exchange; additional offenses.

5. Summary: Adds the following to the list of offenses for which a report and the submission of arrest fingerprints to the Central Criminal Records Exchange is required to be submitted by the arresting law enforcement agency: cruelty to animals; unlawfully operating a school bus on a highway; unlawfully operating a commercial motor vehicle; operating a commercial vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs; refusal to submit to a blood alcohol test; and disregarding or eluding police.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Virginia State Police (VSP) operates the Central Criminal Records Exchange (CCRE), which is the state's criminal records database. The CCRE contains arrest fingerprints and the disposition of all criminal cases adjudicated in the Commonwealth. It is available twenty-four hours a day and seven days a week to criminal justice and law enforcement agencies at the state and federal level. According to VSP, it does not anticipate a fiscal or operational impact as a result of the proposed legislation.
