## Referred to Committee on Appropriations

## Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. § 1. From the certified surplus general fund revenues, there is hereby appropriated \$7 million in 9 grants to the Hampton University Proton Therapy Foundation for the purposes of creating an Advanced 10 Medical Instrumentation Discovery Laboratory at the Hampton University Proton Therapy Institute 11 (HUPTI) in collaboration with the Jefferson National Accelerator Facility and the University of 12 13 Virginia, establishing a Health Care and Industry Radiation Effects Science Business Center to conduct 14 basic scientific and clinical translational applied research at HUPTI, providing HUPTI infrastructure 15 support, and utilizing a HUPTI proton therapy treatment room with novel volumetric imaging capability. Additional terms and conditions relating to the payment of the grants shall be determined by the 16 Secretary of Finance after consultation with the Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations 17 18 and the Senate Committee on Finance, or their designees.

19 § 2. The certification of the certified surplus general fund revenues shall be made by the State
20 Comptroller as soon as practicable.

21 § 3. For purposes of this act:

22 "Certified surplus general fund revenues" means general fund revenues deposited in the state 23 treasury for the Commonwealth's fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, that are in excess of the sum of (i)24 the official general fund revenue forecast for such year pursuant to Chapter 854 of the Acts of Assembly 25 of 2019, (ii) deposits required to be made to the Revenue Stabilization Fund in fiscal year 2020 pursuant to § 2.2-1829 of the Code of Virginia, (iii) deposits required to be made to the Revenue 26 Reserve Fund in fiscal year 2020 pursuant to § 2.2-1831.3 of the Code of Virginia, (iv) deposits 27 28 required to be made to the Virginia Water Quality Improvement Fund in fiscal year 2020 pursuant to 29 § 10.1-2128 of the Code of Virginia, but excluding any deposits provided under the Virginia Natural 30 Resources Commitment Fund established under § 10.1-2128.1 of the Code of Virginia, and (v) any revenues required to be transferred to the Taxpayer Relief Fund in fiscal year 2020 pursuant to the fifth 31 enactments of Chapters 17 and 18 of the Acts of Assembly of 2019 and § 3-5.21 of Chapter 854 of the 32 Acts of Assembly of 2019, as certified by the State Comptroller. 33
