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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

An Act to amend and reenact §§ 46.2-203.1, 46.2-208, 46.2-208.1, and 46.2-380 of the Code of 2 Virginia; to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 46.2-208.3; and to repeal 3 4 §§ 46.2-208.2 and 46.2-213 of the Code of Virginia relating to Department of Motor Vehicles; 5 release of information.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8

9 1. That §§ 46.2-203.1, 46.2-208, 46.2-208.1, and 46.2-380 of the Code of Virginia are amended and 10 reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 46.2-208.3 as follows: 11

12 § 46.2-203.1. Provision of updated addresses by persons completing forms; acknowledgment of 13 future receipt of official notices.

Whenever any person completes a form for an application, certificate of title, registration card, 14 15 license plate, driver's license, and any other form requisite for the purpose of this title, or whenever any person is issued a summons for a violation of the motor vehicle laws of the Commonwealth, he shall 16 provide his current address on the form or summons. By signing the form or summons, the person 17 acknowledges that (i) the address is correct, (ii) any official notice, including an order of suspension, 18 19 will be sent by (a) prepaid first class mail to the address on the signed form with the most current date, 20 or (b) by other means of communication, including email or other electronic address, if such electronic 21 address is provided to the Department on the signed form; and (iii) the notice shall be deemed to have 22 been accepted by the person at that if sent to any such address. In addition, upon signing a summons for 23 a violation of the motor vehicle laws, the person shall acknowledge that his failure to appear in court 24 and pay fines and costs could result in suspension of his operator's license. 25

§ 46.2-208. Records of Department; when open for inspection; release of privileged information.

26 A. All records in the office of the Department containing the specific classes of The information 27 outlined below shall be considered privileged records and, unless otherwise provided for in this title, 28 shall not be released except as provided in subsection B: 29

1. Personal information, including all data as defined as "personal information" in § 2.2-3801;

30 2. Driver information, including defined as all data that relates to driver's license status and driver 31 activity; and

32 3. Special identification card information, defined as all data that relates to identification card 33 status; and

34 4. Vehicle information, including all descriptive vehicle data and title, registration, and vehicle 35 activity data, but excluding crash data.

B. The Commissioner shall release such information only under the following conditions:

37 1. Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, medical data information included in personal 38 data information shall be released only to a physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner as 39 provided in § accordance with a proceeding under §§ 46.2-321 and 46.2-322. 40

2. Insurance data may be released as specified in §§ 46.2-372, 46.2-380, and 46.2-706.

41 3. Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, information disclosed or furnished shall be 42 assessed a fee as specified in § 46.2-214.

43 4. When the person requesting the information is Upon the request of (i) the subject of the information, (ii) the parent or guardian of a minor who is the subject of the information, (iii) the 44 guardian of the subject of the information, (iv) the authorized representative of the subject of the 45 **46** information, or (iv) (v) the owner of the vehicle that is the subject of the information, the Commissioner 47 shall provide him with the requested information and a complete explanation of it. Requests for such information need not be made in writing or in person and may be made orally or by telephone, provided 48 49 that the Department is satisfied that there is adequate verification of the requester's identity. When so 50 requested in writing by (a) the subject of the information, (b) the parent or guardian of a minor who is the subject of the information, (c) the guardian of the subject of the information, (d) the authorized 51 representative of the subject of the information, or (d) (e) the owner of the vehicle that is the subject of 52 53 the information, the Commissioner shall verify and, if necessary, correct the personal information 54 provided and furnish driver and, special identification card, or vehicle information in the form of an 55 abstract of the record. If the requester is requesting such information in the scope of his official business 56 as counsel from a public defender's office or as counsel appointed by a court, such records shall be

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57 *provided free of charge.*

58 5. On Upon the written request of any insurance carrier, surety, or representative of an insurance 59 carrier or surety either, the Commissioner shall furnish to such insurance carrier, surety, or 60 representative an abstract of requester information in the record of any person subject to the provisions 61 of this title. The abstract transcript shall include any record of any conviction of a violation of any 62 provision of any statute or ordinance relating to the operation or ownership of a motor vehicle or of any 63 injury or damage in which he was involved and a report of which is required by § 46.2-372 filed 64 pursuant to § 46.2-373. No such report of any conviction or accident crash shall be made after 60 65 months from the date of the conviction or accident crash unless the Commissioner or court used the conviction or accident crash as a reason for the suspension or revocation of a driver's license or driving 66 67 privilege, in which case the revocation or suspension and any conviction or accident crash pertaining thereto shall not be reported after 60 months from the date that the driver's license or driving privilege 68 69 has been reinstated. This abstract The response of the Commissioner under this subdivision shall not be 70 admissible in evidence in any court proceedings.

6. On Upon the written request of any business organization or its *authorized* agent, in the conduct of its business, the Commissioner shall compare personal information supplied by the business organization or agent *requester* with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by the business organization or agent *requester* is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the business organization or agent *requester* with correct information as contained in the Department's records. Personal information provided under this subdivision shall be used solely for the purpose of pursuing remedies that require locating an individual.

78 7. The Upon the written request of any business organization or its authorized agent, the
 79 Commissioner shall provide vehicle information to any business organization or agent on such business'
 80 or agent's written request the requester. Disclosures made under this subdivision shall not include any
 81 personal information and shall not be subject to the limitations contained in subdivision 6.

82 8. On Upon the written request of any motor vehicle rental or leasing company or its designated 83 *authorized* agent, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by the company or 84 agent requester with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by 85 the company or agent requester is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the 86 company or agent requester with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) 87 provide the company or agent requester with driver information in the form of an abstract of any person 88 subject to the provisions of this title. Such abstract information shall include any record of any 89 conviction of a violation of any provision of any statute or ordinance relating to the operation or 90 ownership of a motor vehicle or of any injury or damage in which the subject of the abstract 91 information was involved and a report of which is required by § 46.2-372 was filed pursuant to § 46.2-373. No such abstract information shall include any record of any conviction or accident crash 92 93 more than 60 months after the date of such conviction or accident crash unless the Commissioner or 94 court used the conviction or accident crash as a reason for the suspension or revocation of a driver's 95 license or driving privilege, in which case the revocation or suspension and any conviction or accident 96 crash pertaining thereto shall cease to be included in such abstract information after 60 months from the 97 date on which the driver's license or driving privilege was reinstated. No abstract released The response 98 of the Commissioner under this subdivision shall not be admissible in evidence in any court proceedings. 99 9. On Upon the request of any federal, state, or local governmental entity, local government group 100 self-insurance pool, law-enforcement officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized

101 agent of any of the foregoing, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by the 102 governmental entity, local government group self-insurance pool, law-enforcement officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, requester with that contained 103 104 in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by the governmental entity, local 105 government group self-insurance pool, law-enforcement officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, 106 or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, requester is different from that contained in the 107 Department's records, provide the governmental entity, local government group self-insurance pool, 108 law-enforcement officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized agent of any of the 109 foregoing requester with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii). The 110 Commissioner shall also provide driver, special identification card, and vehicle information in the form 111 of an abstract of the record showing all convictions, accidents, and driver's license suspensions or revocations as requested pursuant to this subdivision. The Commissioner may also release other 112 113 appropriate information as to the governmental entity, local government group self-insurance pool, 114 law-enforcement officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, may require in order to carry out its official functions upon request. Upon request in 115 accordance with this subdivision, the Commissioner shall furnish a certificate, under seal of the 116 Department, setting forth a distinguishing number or license plate of a motor vehicle, trailer, or 117

118 semitrailer, together with the name and address of its owner. The certificate shall be prima facie 119 evidence in any court in the Commonwealth of the ownership of the vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer to 120 which the distinguishing number or license plate has been assigned by the Department. However, the 121 Commissioner shall not release any photographs pursuant to this subdivision unless the requester 122 provides the depicted individual's name and other sufficient identifying information contained on such 123 individual's record. The abstract information in this subdivision shall be provided free of charge.

124 The Department shall release to a requester information that is required for a requester to carry out 125 the requester's official functions in accordance with this subdivision. If the requester has entered into an 126 agreement with the Department, such agreement shall be in a manner prescribed by the Department, and such agreement shall contain the legal authority that authorizes the performance of the requester's 127 128 official functions and a description of how such information will be used to carry out such official 129 functions. If the Commissioner determines that sufficient authority has not been provided by the 130 requester to show that the purpose for which the information shall be used is one of the requester's 131 official functions, the Commissioner shall refuse to enter into any agreement. If the requester submits a 132 request for information in accordance with this subdivision without an existing agreement to receive the 133 information, the request shall be in a manner prescribed by the Department, and such request shall 134 contain the legal authority that authorizes the performance of the requester's official functions and a 135 description of how such information will be used to carry out such official functions. If the 136 Commissioner determines that sufficient authority has not been provided by the requester to show that 137 the purpose for which such information shall be used is one of the requester's official functions, the 138 Commissioner shall denv such request.

139 10. On Upon the request of the driver licensing authority in any other state or foreign country, the 140 Commissioner shall provide whatever classes of *driver and vehicle* information the requesting authority 141 shall require in order to carry out its official functions. The information shall be provided free of charge. 11. On a. For the purpose of obtaining information regarding noncommercial driver's license holders, upon the written request of any employer, prospective employer, or authorized agent of either, 142 143 144 and with the written consent of the individual concerned, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal 145 information supplied by the employer, prospective employer, or agent requester with that contained in 146 the Department's records and, when the information supplied by the employer, prospective employer, or 147 agent requester is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the employer, 148 prospective employer, or agent requester with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide the employer, prospective employer, or agent requester with driver information 149 150 in the form of an abstract a transcript of an individual's record showing, including all convictions, 151 accidents all crashes, driver's license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the 152 individual currently possesses, and all driver's license suspensions, revocations, cancellations, or 153 forfeiture, provided that the such individual's position or the position that the individual is being 154 considered for involves the operation of a motor vehicle.

155 b. For the purpose of obtaining information regarding commercial driver's license holders, upon the 156 written request of any employer, prospective employer, or authorized agent of either, the Commissioner 157 shall (i) compare personal information supplied by the requester with that contained in the Department's 158 records and, when the information supplied by the requester is different from that contained in the 159 Department's records, provide the requester with correct information as contained in the Department's 160 records and (ii) provide the requester with driver information in the form of a transcript of such individual's record, including all convictions, all crashes, any type of driver's license that the individual 161 162 currently possesses, and all driver's license suspensions, revocations, cancellations, forfeitures, or disqualifications, provided that such individual's position or the position that the individual is being 163 164 considered for involves the operation of a commercial motor vehicle.

165 12. On Upon the written request of any member of a volunteer fire company or volunteer emergency medical services agency and with written consent of the individual concerned, or upon the request of an 166 167 applicant for membership in a volunteer fire company or any volunteer emergency medical services 168 personnel or applicant to serve as volunteer emergency medical services personnel, the Commissioner 169 shall (i) compare personal information supplied by the volunteer fire company or volunteer emergency 170 medical services agency requester with that contained in the Department's records and, when the 171 information supplied by the volunteer fire company or volunteer emergency medical services agency 172 requester is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the volunteer fire 173 company or volunteer emergency medical services agency requester with correct information as 174 contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of an abstract a transcript of the member's, personnel, or applicant's individual's record showing, including all 175 convictions, accidents all crashes, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license 176 177 that the individual currently possesses, and all license suspensions, revocations, cancellations, or forfeitures. Such abstract transcript shall be provided free of charge if the request is accompanied by 178

appropriate written evidence that the person is a member of or applicant for membership in a volunteer
fire company or a volunteer emergency medical services agency to serve as a member of a volunteer
emergency medical services agency and the abstract transcript is needed by a volunteer fire company or
volunteer emergency medical services agency the requester to establish the qualifications of the member,
volunteer, or applicant to operate equipment owned by the volunteer fire company or volunteer
emergency medical services agency.

185 13. On Upon the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer with a Virginia 186 affiliate of Big Brothers/Big Brothers Big Sisters of America, a Virginia affiliate of Compeer, or the 187 Virginia Council of the Girl Scouts of the USA, and with the consent of the individual who is the subject 188 of the information and has applied to be a volunteer with the requester, or on the written request of a 189 Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross, a Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol, or Faith in 190 Action, and with the consent of the individual who is the subject of the information and applied to be a 191 volunteer vehicle operator with the requester, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information 192 supplied by a Virginia affiliate of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America the requester with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by a Virginia affiliate of Big 193 194 Brothers/Big Sisters of America the requester is different from that contained in the Department's 195 records, provide the Virginia affiliate of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America requester with correct 196 information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of 197 an abstract a transcript of the applicant's record showing, including all convictions, accidents all 198 *crashes*, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently 199 possesses, and all license suspensions, revocations, cancellations, or forfeitures. Such abstract transcript 200 shall be provided at a fee that is one-half the normal charge if the request is accompanied by 201 appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer or volunteer vehicle operator 202 with a Virginia affiliate of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America the requester as provided in this 203 subdivision.

14. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer with a court-appointed special advocate program pursuant to § 9.1-153, the Commissioner shall provide an abstract a transcript of the applicant's record showing, including all convictions, accidents all crashes, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses, and all license suspensions, revocations, cancellations, or forfeitures. Such abstract transcript shall be provided free of charge if the request is accompanied by appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer with a court-appointed special advocate program pursuant to § 9.1-153.

211 15. Upon the request of any employer, prospective employer, or authorized representative of either, 212 the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by the employer, prospective 213 employer, or agent with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied 214 by the employer, prospective employer, or agent is different from that contained in the Department's 215 records, provide the employer, prospective employer, or agent with correct information as contained in 216 the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of an abstract of the driving record of any individual who has been issued a commercial driver's license, provided that the 217 218 individual's position or the position that the individual is being considered for involves the operation of 219 a commercial motor vehicle. Such abstract shall show all convictions, accidents, license suspensions, 220 revocations, or disqualifications, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses.

16. Upon the receipt of a completed application and payment of applicable processing fees, the
 Commissioner may enter into an agreement with any governmental authority or business to exchange
 information specified in this section by electronic or other means.

17. Upon the request of an attorney representing a person *involved* in a motor vehicle accident *crash*,
the Commissioner shall provide *the* vehicle information *for any vehicle involved in the crash*, including
and the owner's name and address, to the attorney of the owner of any such vehicle.

227 18. Upon the request, in the course of business, of any authorized representative of an insurance 228 company or of any not-for-profit entity organized to prevent and detect insurance fraud, or perform 229 rating and underwriting activities, the Commissioner shall provide to such person (i) all vehicle 230 information, including the owner's name and address, descriptive data and title, registration, and vehicle 231 activity data, as requested, or (ii) all driver information, including name, license number and 232 classification, date of birth, and address information for each driver under the age of 22 licensed in the 233 Commonwealth of Virginia meeting the request criteria designated by such person, with provided that 234 such request criteria consisting of includes the driver's license number or address information. No such 235 information shall be used for solicitation of sales, marketing, or other commercial purposes of such 236 driver. Use of such information shall be limited to use in connection with insurance claims investigation 237 activities, antifraud activities, rating, or underwriting.

238 19. Upon the request of an officer authorized to issue criminal warrants, for the purpose of issuing a
 239 warrant for arrest for unlawful disposal of trash or refuse in violation of § 33.2-802 the Commissioner

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240 shall provide vehicle information, including the owner's name and address.

241 20. Upon *the* written request of the compliance agent of a private security services business, as
242 defined in § 9.1-138, which is licensed by the *Virginia* Department of Criminal Justice Services, the
243 Commissioner shall provide the name and address of the owner of the vehicle under procedures
244 determined by the Commissioner.

245 21. Upon the request of the operator of a toll facility Θr , a traffic light photo-monitoring system 246 acting on behalf of a government entity, or of the Dulles Access Highway, or an authorized agent or 247 employee of a toll facility operator or traffic light photo-monitoring system operator acting on behalf of 248 a government entity or the Dulles Access Highway, for the purpose of obtaining vehicle owner data 249 under subsection M of § 46.2-819.1 or subsection H of § 15.2-968.1 or subsection N of § 46.2-819.5. 250 Information released pursuant to this subdivision shall be limited to the name and address of the owner 251 of the vehicle having failed to pay a toll or having failed to comply with a traffic light signal or having 252 improperly used the Dulles Access Highway and the vehicle information, including all descriptive 253 vehicle data and title and registration data of the same vehicle.

254 22. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer with a Virginia affiliate 255 of Compeer, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by a Virginia affiliate of 256 Compeer with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by a 257 Virginia affiliate of Competer is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the 258 Virginia affiliate of Compeer with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) 259 provide driver information in the form of an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, 260 accidents, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract shall be provided at a fee that is one-half the normal charge if the 261 262 request is accompanied by appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer 263 with a Virginia affiliate of Compeer.

264 23. Upon the request of the Department of Environmental Quality for the purpose of obtaining
 265 vehicle owner data in connection with enforcement actions involving on-road testing of motor vehicles,
 266 pursuant to § 46.2-1178.1.

267 24. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a 268 Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information 269 supplied by a Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross with that contained in the Department's 270 records and, when the information supplied by a Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross is different 271 from that contained in the Department's records, provide the Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross 272 with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in 273 the form of an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions 274 or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract 275 shall be provided at a fee that is one-half the normal charge if the request is accompanied by 276 appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a 277 Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross.

278 25. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a 279 Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information 280 supplied by a Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol with that contained in the Department's records 281 and, when the information supplied by a Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol is different from that 282 contained in the Department's records, provide the Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol with correct 283 information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of 284 an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions or 285 revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract shall 286 be provided at a fee that is one-half the normal charge if the request is accompanied by appropriate 287 written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a Virginia chapter of 288 the Civil Air Patrol.

289 26. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with 290 Faith in Action, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by Faith in Action 291 with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by Faith in Action is 292 different from that contained in the Department's records, provide Faith in Action with correct 293 information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of 294 an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions or 295 revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract shall 296 be provided at a fee that is one-half the normal charge if the request is accompanied by appropriate 297 written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with Faith in Action.

27. On Upon the written request of the surviving spouse or child of a deceased person or the
executor or administrator of a deceased person's estate, the Department shall, if the deceased person had
been issued a driver's license or special identification card by the Department, supply the requestor

301 requester with a hard copy image of any photograph of the deceased person kept in the Department's 302 records.

303 28. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer with a Virginia Council 304 of the Girl Scouts of the USA, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by a 305 Virginia Council of the Girl Scouts of the USA with that contained in the Department's records and, 306 when the information supplied by a Virginia Council of the Girl Scouts of the USA is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide a Virginia Council of the Girl Scouts of the USA 307 308 with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in 309 the form of an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions 310 or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract 311 shall be provided at a fee that is one-half the normal charge if the request is accompanied by 312 appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer with the Virginia Council of 313 the Girl Scouts of the USA.

314 29. a. Upon written agreement, the Commissioner may digitally verify the authenticity and validity of 315 a driver's license, learner's permit, or special identification card to the American Association of Motor 316 Vehicle Administrators, a motor vehicle dealer as defined in § 46.2-1500, or other another organization 317 approved by the Commissioner.

318 b. The Commissioner may release information in the Department's record through any American 319 Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators service program created for the purpose of the exchange of information to any business, government agency, or authorized agent who would otherwise be 320 321 authorized to receive the information requested pursuant to this section.

322 30. Upon the request of the operator of a video-monitoring system as defined in § 46.2-844 acting on 323 behalf of a government entity, the Commissioner shall provide vehicle owner data pursuant to subsection B of § 46.2-844. Information released pursuant to this subdivision shall be limited to the name and 324 325 address of the owner of the vehicle having passed a stopped school bus and the vehicle information, including all descriptive vehicle data and title and registration data for such vehicle. 326

327 31. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section other than subdivision 32, the Department shall not 328 release, except upon request by the subject of the information, the guardian of the subject of the 329 information, the parent of a minor who is the subject of the information, or the authorized 330 representative of the subject of the information, or pursuant to a court order, (i) proof documents submitted for the purpose of obtaining a driving credential or a special identification card, (ii) the 331 332 information in the Department's records indicating the type of proof documentation that was provided, 333 or (iii) applications relating to the issuance of a driving credential or a special identification card. As used in this subdivision, "proof document" means any document not originally created by the 334 335 Department that is submitted to the Department for the issuance of any driving credential or special identification card. "Proof document" does not include any information contained on a driving credential or special identification card. 336 337

338 32. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the Department may release the information in the 339 Department's records that it deems reasonable and necessary for the purpose of federal compliance 340 audits.

341 C. Whenever the Commissioner issues an order to suspend or revoke the driver's license or driving 342 privilege of any individual, he may notify the National Driver Register Service operated by the United 343 States Department of Transportation and any similar national driver information system and provide 344 whatever classes of information the authority may require Information disclosed or furnished shall be 345 assessed a fee as specified in § 46.2-214, unless as otherwise provided in this section. 346

D. Accident reports may be inspected under the provisions of §§ 46.2-379 and 46.2-380.

347 E. Whenever the Commissioner takes any licensing action pursuant to the provisions of the Virginia 348 Commercial Driver's License Act (§ 46.2-341.1 et seq.), he may provide information to the Commercial 349 Driver License Information System, or any similar national commercial driver information system, 350 regarding such action.

351 F. In addition to the foregoing provisions of this section, vehicle information may also be inspected 352 under the provisions of §§ 46.2-633, 46.2-644.02, 46.2-644.03, and §§ 46.2-1200.1 through 46.2-1237.

353 G. The Department may promulgate regulations to govern the means by which personal, vehicle, and 354 driver information is requested and disseminated.

355 H. Driving records of any person accused of an offense involving the operation of a motor vehicle 356 shall be provided by the Commissioner upon request to any person acting as counsel for the accused. If 357 such counsel is from the public defender's office or has been appointed by the court, such records shall 358 be provided free of charge.

359 1. The Department shall maintain the records of persons convicted of violations of § 18.2-36.2, subsection B of § 29.1-738, and §§ 29.1-738.02, 29.1-738.2, and 29.1-738.4 which shall be forwarded by 360 361 every general district court or circuit court or the clerk thereof, pursuant to § 46.2-383. Such records

362 shall be electronically available to any law-enforcement officer as provided for under clause (ii) of 363 subdivision B 9.

J. Whenever the Commissioner issues a certificate of title for a motor vehicle, he may notify the
 National Motor Vehicle Title Information System, or any other nationally recognized system providing
 similar information, or any entity contracted to collect information for such system, and may provide
 whatever classes of information are required by such system.

368 D. Upon the receipt of a completed application and payment of applicable processing fees, the
 369 Commissioner may enter into an agreement with any governmental authority or business to exchange
 370 information specified in this section by electronic or other means.

371 § 46.2-208.1. Electronic transfer of information in Department records for voter registration 372 purposes.

Notwithstanding the provisions of § 46.2-208, the Commissioner shall provide for the electronic transfer of information from the Department's records to the State Board Department of Elections and the general registrars for the purpose of voter registration as required by Chapter 4 (§ 24.2-400 et seq.)
of Title 24.2, including but not limited to the purposes of § 24.2-410.1. Except as provided in §§ 24.2-404 and 24.2-444, the State Board Department of Elections and the general registrars shall not make information provided by the Department available to the public and shall not provide such information to any third party.

§ 46.2-208.3. Notice by Department.

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The Department may send notice of a driver's license renewal pursuant to § 46.2-330 or a vehicle
registration renewal in the form of a postcard to a customer at the address shown on the records of the
Department. Notwithstanding the provisions of § 46.2-208, the Department may put sufficient
information on the face of the postcard to provide the recipient with adequate notice of renewal. Such
information shall only be disclosed as permitted in this section.

386 § 46.2-380. Reports made under certain sections open to inspection by certain persons; copies;
 387 maintenance of reports and photographs for three-year period.

388 A. Any report of an accident a crash made pursuant to § 46.2-372, 46.2-373, 46.2-375, or 46.2-377 389 shall be maintained by the Department in either hard copy or electronic form for a period of at least 36 390 months from the date of the accident and crash. The report shall be open to the inspection of (i) any 391 person involved or injured in the accident crash or as a result thereof, or his attorney, or any person 392 owning a vehicle or property involved in the crash, or his attorney, (ii) any authorized representative of 393 any insurance carrier reasonably anticipating exposure to civil liability as a consequence of the accident 394 *crash* or to which the person has applied for issuance or renewal of a policy of automobile insurance, or 395 (iii) the FMCSA or any authorized agent thereof. The Commissioner shall, on upon written request of 396 the person authorized to inspect the report, furnish a copy of the report, in either hard copy or electronic form, at the expense of the requester. Any such report shall also be open to inspection by the 397 398 personal representative of any person injured or killed in the accident crash, including his guardian, 399 conservator, executor, committee, next of kin as defined in § 54.1-2800, or administrator, or, if the 400 person injured or killed is under 18 years of age, his parent or guardian. The Commissioner shall only 401 be required to furnish under this section copies of reports required by the provisions of this article to be 402 made directly to the Commissioner. The Commissioner may set a reasonable fee for furnishing a copy 403 of any report, provide to whom payment shall be made, and establish a procedure for payment.

B. The Commissioner or Superintendent of State Police having a copy of any photograph taken by a law-enforcement officer relating to a nonfatal accident crash shall maintain the negatives for or an electronic record of such photographs in their records for at least 36 months from the date of the accident crash.
