10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 11

12 1. That § 2.2-2101 the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is 13 amended by adding in Chapter 25 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 11, consisting of sections 14 numbered 2.2-2544 through 2.2-2550, as follows:

- § 2.2-2101. Prohibition against service by legislators on boards, commissions, and councils 15 within the executive branch; exceptions. 16
- Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 17 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 18 19 20 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the 21 appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the 22 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 23 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another 24 person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

54 Commission to Study Slavery and Subsequent De Jure and De Facto Racial and Economic Discrimination 55 Against African Americans.

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§ 2.2-2544. Commission to Study Slavery and Subsequent De Jure and De Facto Racial and 56 57 Economic Discrimination Against African Americans; purpose.

58 The Commission to Study Slavery and Subsequent De Jure and De Facto Racial and Economic 59 Discrimination Against African Americans (the Commission) is established as an advisory commission in 60 the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the Commission is to study the current impact 61 and long-term inequities of slavery and subsequent de jure and de facto racial and economic 62 discrimination against African Americans.

§ 2.2-2545. Membership; terms; vacancies; chairman and vice-chairman. 63

A. The Commission shall consist of 11 members, including three legislative members and eight 64 nonlegislative citizen members. Members shall be appointed as follows: (i) two members of the House of 65 Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles 66 of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates, (ii) one member of the 67 68 Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, (iii) eight nonlegislative citizen members to 69 be appointed by the Governor. Nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be citizens of the 70 Commonwealth.

71 B. Legislative members of the Commission shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. 72 Nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for a term of two years. Appointments to fill 73 vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Legislative members and 74 nonlegislative citizen members may be reappointed. However, no nonlegislative citizen member shall 75 serve more than four consecutive two-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for 76 77 reappointment. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. 78

C. The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership.

79 § 2.2-2546. Quorum: meetings.

80 A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The meetings of the Commission shall be held 81 at the call of the chairman or whenever a majority of the members so request. 82

§ 2.2-2547. Compensation; expenses.

83 Legislative members of the Commission shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12. 84 Nonlegislative citizen members shall not receive compensation. All members shall be reimbursed for 85 reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Compensation to members of the General Assembly for attendance at official 86 87 meetings of the Commission shall be paid by the office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates or office 88 of the Clerk of the Senate, as applicable. Reimbursement for the reasonable and necessary expenses of 89 nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be paid by the State Library. 90

§ 2.2-2548. Powers and duties of the Commission.

A. The Commission shall have the power and duty to:

92 1. Identify and compile documentation of (i) the institution of slavery that existed within the United 93 States and Virginia from 1619 through 1865; (ii) the role that the federal and state governments played 94 in supporting the institution of slavery through constitutional and statutory provisions; (iii) federal and 95 state laws that discriminated against formerly enslaved Africans and their descendants who were deemed 96 United States citizens from 1868 to the present; (iv) state-sanctioned efforts to deny equal rights to African Americans, including the Black Codes, Jim Crow laws, and the campaign to avoid implementing 97 98 public school integration in Virginia known as massive resistance; (v) other forms of discrimination in 99 the public and private sectors against formerly enslaved Africans and their descendants who were deemed United States citizens from 1868 to the present, including redlining, educational funding 100 discrepancies, and predatory financial practices; and (v) the lingering negative effects of the institution 101 102 of slavery.

103 2. Examine the pervasive institutional system of maintaining inequities in housing, employment, 104 education, economic opportunities, generational wealth, voting rights, and criminal justice.

105 3. Recommend methods to promote educational awareness and identify ways to address the 106 systematic and historical implications affecting the quality of life of a significant population of African 107 American families in the Commonwealth. 108

4. Recommend appropriate ways to educate the public regarding the Commission's findings.

109 5. Submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual report for publication as a report 110 document as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports. The chairman shall submit to the Governor and the 111 112 General Assembly an annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Commission no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall 113 be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the Division of 114 Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be 115 posted on the General Assembly's website. 116

117 B. The Commission may contract with consultants to assist in carrying out its duties under

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- § 2.2-2549. Staffing; cooperation of agencies of state and local governments. The State Library shall provide staff support to the Commission. All agencies of the Commonwealth 121 122 shall cooperate with, and provide assistance to, the Commission, upon request.
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- § 2.2-2550. Sunset. This article shall expire on July 1, 2022. 124
