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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 18.2-415 of the Code of Virginia, relating to disorderly conduct; 3 students.

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### Approved

#### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6 7

#### 1. That § 18.2-415 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

## § 18.2-415. Disorderly conduct in public places.

9 A. A person is guilty of disorderly conduct if, with the intent to cause public inconvenience, 10 annoyance, or alarm, or recklessly creating a risk thereof, he:

A. 1. In any street, highway, or public building, or while in or on a public conveyance, or while in a 11 public place engages in conduct having a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person or 12 13 persons at whom, individually, such conduct is directed; or

B. 2. Willfully or being intoxicated, whether willfully or not, and whether such intoxication results 14 15 from self-administered alcohol or other drug of whatever nature, disrupts any funeral, memorial service, or meeting of the governing body of any political subdivision of this Commonwealth or a division or 16 agency thereof, or of any school, literary society, or place of religious worship, if the disruption (i) 17 prevents or interferes with the orderly conduct of the funeral, memorial service, or meeting or (ii) has a 18 19 direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person or persons at whom, individually, the disruption 20 is directed; or

21 C. 3. Willfully or while intoxicated, whether willfully or not, and whether such intoxication results 22 from self-administered alcohol or other drug of whatever nature, disrupts the operation of any school or 23 any activity conducted or sponsored by any school, if the disruption (i) prevents or interferes with the 24 orderly conduct of the operation or activity or (ii) has a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the 25 person or persons at whom, individually, the disruption is directed.

26 However, the B. The conduct prohibited under subdivision subsection A, B or C of this section shall 27 not be deemed to include the utterance or display of any words or to include conduct otherwise made 28 punishable under this title.

29 C. The person in charge of any such building, place, conveyance, meeting, operation, or activity may 30 eject therefrom any person who violates any provision of this section, with the aid, if necessary, of any 31 persons who may be called upon for such purpose.

32 D. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any elementary or secondary school student if the 33 disorderly conduct occurred on the property of any elementary or secondary school, on a school bus as 34 defined in § 46.2-100, or at any activity conducted or sponsored by any elementary or secondary school. 35 E. The governing bodies of counties, cities, and towns are authorized to adopt ordinances prohibiting

36 and punishing the acts and conduct prohibited by this section, provided that the punishment fixed therefor shall not exceed that prescribed for a Class 1 misdemeanor. A person violating any provision of 37 this section shall be is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. 38

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
