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HOUSE BILL NO. 854

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the House Committee on Rules on February 7, 2020)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Murphy)

A BILL to request the Department of Housing and Community Development and the Virginia Housing and Development Authority to study ways to incentivize the development of affordable housing in the Commonwealth of Virginia; report.

9 Whereas, affordable housing is becoming more and more difficult for many individuals and families 10 to acquire throughout all regions (suburban, urban, and rural) of the Commonwealth; and

11 Whereas, anticipated economic and workforce growth will significantly increase the need for affordable housing in the Commonwealth; and 12

Whereas, the preservation and expansion of assisted, affordable multifamily housing is one of the 13 14 most important housing issues facing the Commonwealth; and

15 Whereas, the high cost burden of housing, especially for lower-wage earners or those with special 16 needs, is contributing to housing instability and homelessness; now, therefore, 17

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. § 1. That the Department of Housing and Community Development and the Virginia Housing and 18 Development Authority be requested to study ways to incentivize the development of affordable housing 19 20 in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

21 In conducting its study, the Department of Housing and Community Development and the Virginia 22 Housing and Development Authority shall convene a stakeholder advisory group consisting of 23 individuals with expertise in land development, construction, affordable housing, real estate finance, tax 24 credit syndication, and other areas of expertise as determined by the Department of Housing and 25 Community Development and the Virginia Housing and Development Authority, and at least one resident of an affordable housing property. Such advisory group shall (i) determine the quantity and quality of 26 affordable housing and workforce housing across the Commonwealth, (ii) conduct a review of current 27 28 programs and policies to determine the effectiveness of current housing policy efforts, (iii) develop an 29 informed projection of future housing needs in the Commonwealth and determine the order of priority of 30 those needs, and (iv) make recommendations for the improvement of housing policy in the 31 Commonwealth. 32

The advisory group shall consider the following proposals as well as other proposals it considers 33 advisable during the course of its analysis and deliberations: (a) a Virginia rent subsidy program to 34 work in conjunction with the federal Housing Choice Voucher Program, (b) utility rate reduction for 35 qualified affordable housing, (c) real property tax reduction for qualified affordable housing for 36 localities that desire to provide such an incentive, (d) bond financing options for qualified affordable 37 housing, and (e) existing programs to increase the supply of qualified affordable housing.

38 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of Housing and 39 Community Development and the Virginia Housing and Development Authority for this study, upon 40 request.

41 The Department of Housing and Community Development and the Virginia Housing and 42 Development Authority shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2020, and shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of the findings and 43 recommendations of the stakeholder advisory group for publication as a House or Senate document. The 44 executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of 45 Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the 46 47 first day of the 2021 Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General **48** Assembly's website.

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
