2	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3	(Proposed by the House Committee on Rules
4	on February 7, 2020) (Petron Prior to Substitute – Delegate Recoul)
5 6	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Rasoul) Requesting the Department of Rail and Public Transportation to study the feasibility of an east-west
7	Commonwealth Corridor passenger rail service. Report.
8	WHEREAS, Virginia is a leader in expanding and improving intercity passenger rail service; and
9	WHEREAS, Virginia launched new intercity passenger rail service between Lynchburg and
10	Washington, D.C., in 2009 and Richmond and Washington, D.C., in 2010; and
11	WHEREAS, Virginia extended the Richmond - Washington, D.C., service to Norfolk in 2013 and the
12 13	Lynchburg - Washington, D.C., service to Roanoke in 2017; and WHEREAS, intercity passenger rail service provides a beneficial alternative to the use of highways
13 14	for travelers, especially students, business travelers, and tourists; and
15	WHEREAS, by providing an alternative to using highways, increased use of intercity passenger rail
16	service can reduce highway congestion, generate economic development, and improve air quality; and
17	WHEREAS, in 2017 Amtrak trains in Virginia removed 568 million passenger miles from our
18	roadways, reduced carbon pollution by 233 million pounds, generated nearly \$1.1 billion in economic
19 20	benefits, and sustained over 11,000 jobs; and WHEREAS, there is no east-west cross-state intercity passenger rail service in Virginia; and
2 0 2 1	WHEREAS, to travel by train from Norfolk to Roanoke would take 16 hours, which includes a
22	six-hour layover in Washington, D.C.; and
23	WHEREAS, an intercity passenger rail corridor between Hampton Roads and the New River Valley
24	would improve transportation connectivity for 3.7 million Virginians, 1.4 million jobs, and 330,000
25 26	higher education students; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department of Rail and
20 27	Public Transportation (DRPT) be requested to study the feasibility of an east-west Commonwealth
28	Corridor passenger rail service. The Commonwealth Corridor passenger rail service would connect
29	Hampton Roads, Richmond, and the New River Valley.
30	In conducting its study, the DRPT shall assess the feasibility, desirability, and possibility of
31 32	expanding intercity passenger rail service connecting the metropolitan areas from Hampton Roads through Richmond to the New River Valley.
32 33	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the DRPT for this study, upon request.
34	The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$300,000 and shall be paid for from funds
35	appropriated by the General Assembly to study the feasibility of an east-west Commonwealth Corridor
36	passenger rail service connecting Hampton Roads, Richmond, and the New River Valley.
37 38	The DRPT shall complete its meetings by July 1, 2021, and shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and recommendations for
39	publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as
40	provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of
41	legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2022 Regular Session of the General
42	Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
