9 10	WHEREAS, ransomware is a malicious software code that incapacitates a computer system until a
10	ransom fee is paid; and
12	WHEREAS, ransomware is disseminated through phishing emails with malicious attachments; and
13	WHEREAS, vulnerable state agencies and localities may be extorted for large sums of money before
13	access to infected systems is restored; and
15	WHEREAS, ransomware can disrupt user access to sensitive or proprietary information; now,
16	therefore, be it
17	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia Information
18	Technologies Agency be requested to study ransomware attack preparedness.
19	In conducting its study, the Virginia Information Technologies Agency shall (i) assess the
20	Commonwealth's susceptibility to ransomware attacks at the state and local levels of government; (ii)
21	develop guidelines and best practices to prevent ransomware attacks; (iii) evaluate current data
22	encryption and backup strategies; (iv) evaluate the availability of tools to monitor unusual access
23	requests, viruses, and network traffic; (v) develop guidance for state agencies and localities on
24	responding in the event of a ransomware attack; (vi) develop a coordinated law-enforcement response
25	strategy that utilizes forensic investigative techniques to identify the source of ransomware attacks; and
26	(vii) provide recommendations on legislative or regulatory changes to better protect state and local
27	government entities from ransomware.
28	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Virginia Information Technologies
29	Agency for this study, upon request.
30	The Virginia Information Technologies Agency shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2020,
31	and shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its
32	findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary
22	and report shall be submitted as provided in the precedures of the Division of Legislative Automated

and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2021
Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
