# VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 53.1-234 and 54.1-3307 of the Code of Virginia, relating to practice of 3 pharmacy; compounding; regulation by Board of Pharmacy.

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#### Approved

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That §§ 53.1-234 and 54.1-3307 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 8 § 53.1-234. Transfer of prisoner; how death sentence executed; who to be present.

9 The clerk of the circuit court in which is pronounced the sentence of death against any person shall, 10 after such judgment becomes final in the circuit court, deliver a certified copy thereof to the Director. Such person so sentenced to death shall be confined prior to the execution of the sentence in a state 11 12 correctional facility designated by the Director. Prior to the time fixed in the judgment of the court for 13 the execution of the sentence, the Director shall cause the condemned prisoner to be conveyed to the 14 state correctional facility housing the death chamber.

15 The Director, or the assistants appointed by him, shall at the time named in the sentence, unless a 16 suspension of execution is ordered, cause the prisoner under sentence of death to be electrocuted or 17 injected with a lethal substance, until he is dead. The method of execution shall be chosen by the 18 prisoner. In the event the prisoner refuses to make a choice at least 15 days prior to the scheduled 19 execution, the method of execution shall be by lethal injection. Execution by lethal injection shall be 20 permitted in accordance with procedures developed by the Department. At the execution, there shall be 21 present the Director or an assistant, a physician employed by the Department or his assistant, such other employees of the Department as may be required by the Director, and, in addition thereto, at least six 22 23 citizens who shall not be employees of the Department. In addition, the counsel for the prisoner and a 24 clergyman may be present.

25 The Director may make and enter into contracts with a pharmacy, as defined in § 54.1-3300, or an 26 outsourcing facility, as defined in § 54.1-3401, for the compounding of drugs necessary to carry out an 27 execution by lethal injection. Any such drugs provided to the Department pursuant to the terms of such a contract shall be used only for the purpose of carrying out an execution by lethal injection. The 28 29 compounding of such drugs pursuant to the terms of such a contract (i) shall not constitute the practice of pharmacy as defined in § 54.1-3300; (ii) is not subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Pharmacy, 30 31 the Board of Medicine, or the Department of Health Professions; and (iii) is exempt from the provisions 32 of Chapter 33 (§ 54.1-3300 et seq.) of Title 54.1 and the Drug Control Act (§ 54.1-3400 et seq.). The 33 pharmacy or outsourcing facility providing such drugs to the Department pursuant to the terms of such a 34 contract shall label each such drug with the drug name, its quantity, a projected expiration date for the 35 drug, and a statement that the drug shall be used only by the Department for the purpose of carrying out 36 an execution by lethal injection.

37 The identities identity of any pharmacy or outsourcing facility that enters into a contract with the 38 Department for the compounding of drugs necessary to carry out an execution by lethal injection, any 39 officer or employee of such pharmacy or outsourcing facility, and any person or entity used by such 40 pharmacy or outsourcing facility to obtain equipment or substances to facilitate the compounding of such 41 drugs and any information reasonably calculated to lead to the identities of such persons or entities, 42 including their names, shall not be confidential, shall be subject to the Virginia Freedom of Information 43 Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.), and may be subject to discovery or introduction as evidence in any civil proceeding. However, the residential and office addresses, residential and office telephone numbers, 44 social security numbers, and tax identification numbers, of officers and employees of the outsourcing 45 46 facility and any person or entity used by the outsourcing facility to obtain equipment or substances to facilitate the compounding of such drugs shall be confidential, shall be and exempt from the Virginia 47 Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.), and shall not be subject to discovery or introduction as 48 49 evidence in any civil proceeding unless good cause is shown. 50

## § 54.1-3307. Specific powers and duties of Board.

A. The Board shall regulate the practice of pharmacy and the manufacturing, dispensing, selling, 51 distributing, processing, compounding, or disposal of drugs and devices. The Board shall also control the 52 53 character and standard of all drugs, cosmetics, and devices within the Commonwealth, investigate all 54 complaints as to the quality and strength of all drugs, cosmetics, and devices, and take such action as 55 may be necessary to prevent the manufacturing, dispensing, selling, distributing, processing, 56 compounding, and disposal of such drugs, cosmetics, and devices that do not conform to the

57 requirements of law.

58 The Board's regulations shall include criteria for:

59 1. Maintenance of the quality, quantity, integrity, safety, and efficacy of drugs or devices distributed, 60 dispensed, or administered.

61 2. Compliance with the prescriber's instructions regarding the drug, and its quantity, quality, and 62 directions for use. 63

3. Controls and safeguards against diversion of drugs or devices.

4. Maintenance of the integrity of, and public confidence in, the profession and improving the 64 65 delivery of quality pharmaceutical services to the citizens of Virginia.

5. Maintenance of complete records of the nature, quantity, or quality of drugs or substances 66 67 distributed or dispensed, and of all transactions involving controlled substances or drugs or devices so as 68 to provide adequate information to the patient, the practitioner, or the Board.

6. Control of factors contributing to abuse of legitimately obtained drugs, devices, or controlled 69 70 substances.

71 7. Promotion of scientific or technical advances in the practice of pharmacy and the manufacture and 72 distribution of controlled drugs, devices, or substances.

73 8. Impact on costs to the public and within the health care industry through the modification of 74 mandatory practices and procedures not essential to meeting the criteria set out in subdivisions 1 through 75 7 of this section.

76 9. Such other factors as may be relevant to, and consistent with, the public health and safety and the 77 cost of rendering pharmacy services.

B. The Board may collect and examine specimens of drugs, devices, and cosmetics that are 78 79 manufactured, distributed, stored, or dispensed in the Commonwealth.

80 C. The Board shall report annually by December 1 to the Chairmen of the Senate Committee on Education and Health and the House Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions on (i) the number 81

of outsourcing facilities permitted or registered by the Board that have entered into a contract with the 82

Department of Corrections for the compounding of drugs necessary to carry out an execution by lethal injection pursuant to § 53.1-234 and (ii) the name of any such outsourcing facilities that received 83 84

disciplinary action for a violation of law or regulation related to compounding. 85
