FLOOR AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by Senator Lucas on February 5, 2020)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Lucas)

5 6 A BILL to establish the Commission for Historical Statues in the United States Capitol to provide for 7 the replacement of the Robert E. Lee statue in the National Statuary Hall Collection at the United 8 States Capitol, to recommend to the General Assembly as a replacement a statue of a prominent 9 Virginia citizen of historic renown or renowned for distinguished civil or military service to be 10 commemorated in the National Statuary Hall Collection, and to provide for the selection of a 11 sculptor for the new statue; and to provide for submission of the Commonwealth's request to the Joint Committee of Congress on the Library for approval to replace the Robert E. Lee statue in the 12 National Statuary Hall Collection at the United States Capitol. 13

14 Whereas, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 2131, each state is permitted to provide and furnish to the United 15 States Capitol two statues, in marble or bronze, of deceased persons who have been prominent citizens of the state for placement in the National Statuary Hall Collection; and 16

17 Whereas, currently, Virginia has two statues, of George Washington and Robert E. Lee, in the National Statuary Hall Collection; and 18

19 Whereas, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 2132, a state may request that the Joint Committee of Congress on 20 the Library approve the replacement of any statue the state has provided for display in the National 21 Statuary Hall Collection at the United States Capitol; now, therefore,

22 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

23 **1.** § 1. The Commission for Historical Statues in the United States Capitol (the Commission) is 24 established to determine who in addition to George Washington should represent Virginia in the 25 National Statuary Hall Collection at the United States Capitol and to recommend to the General Assembly, if the Commission so chooses pursuant to § 5 to replace the statue of Robert E. Lee, a statue 26 of a prominent Virginia citizen of historic renown or renowned for distinguished civil or military service 27 28 to be commemorated in the National Statuary Hall Collection. The Commission shall consist of eight 29 members as follows: one member of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the 30 House of Delegates; one member of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; two nonlegislative citizen members who are Virginia or American historians to be appointed by the 31 32 Governor; three nonlegislative citizen members appointed upon the vote of the Commission members 33 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, the Senate Committee on Rules, and the Governor; 34 and the Director of the Department of Historic Resources, who shall serve ex officio with nonvoting 35 privileges.

36 § 2. Legislative members and the ex officio member shall serve terms coincident with their terms of 37 office. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments.

38 § 3. The members of the Commission shall select a chairman and a vice-chairman. The chairman 39 shall be a member of the General Assembly. A majority of the voting members shall constitute a 40 quorum. The Commission shall meet at the call of the chairman or whenever a majority of the voting 41 members request.

42 § 4. Members of the Commission shall be compensated for their service and reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in the 43 44 general appropriation act.

§ 5. The Commission shall determine whether the statue of Robert E. Lee should remain or be 45 replaced in the National Statuary Hall Collection representing the Commonwealth of Virginia. If the 46 Commission determines that the Robert E. Lee statue should be replaced, the Commission shall have the 47 **48** following duties:

49 1. To provide for the replacement of the Robert E. Lee statue in the National Statuary Hall 50 Collection at the United States Capitol.

51 2. To recommend to the General Assembly as a replacement a statue of a prominent Virginia citizen of historic renown or renowned for distinguished civil or military service that is compatible with the 52 53 historical character and design of the United States Capitol. Prior to any final recommendation to the 54 General Assembly, the Commission shall hold at least one public hearing to receive input and comments 55 relating to its developed plans for the new statue.

3. To select a sculptor in accordance with any guidelines prescribed pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 2131 56 57 with preference given to a sculptor from Virginia to design a statue of the prominent Virginia citizen selected pursuant to subdivision 2. 58

59 4. To estimate the costs associated with the replacement of the Robert E. Lee statue, including the

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60 costs to design, construct, transport, and place the new statue, for the removal and transfer of the 61 Robert E. Lee statue, and for any unveiling ceremony for the new statue.

5. To recommend to the General Assembly a suitable state, local, or private nonprofit history
 museum in the Commonwealth for placement of the Robert E. Lee statue.

64 § 6. In carrying out its duties, the Commission may hold meetings at any place within the
65 Commonwealth; enter into contracts, memorandums of understanding, and collaborative arrangements;
66 participate in fundraising to procure a new statue; seek private funding for the operation and support of
67 the Commission; and undertake all other lawful acts that are consistent with effectuating the purposes of
68 this act.

69 § 7. The costs of implementation of the Commission and its work shall be borne by the Commission
70 from such private funds raised, bequeathed, or granted to the Commission and general funds as are
71 appropriated by the General Assembly to cover the costs of its operation and work.

§ 8. The Department of Historic Resources shall provide staff support to the Commission, including
 research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the Commission. All agencies of the
 Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request.

75 § 9. Until completion of the Commission's work, the Commission shall report by December 1, 2020, 76 and by December 1 annually thereafter the status of its work, including any findings and 77 recommendations, to the Governor and the General Assembly. If known at the time, the report shall 78 include (i) the prominent Virginia citizen selected for commemoration in the National Statuary Hall Collection at the United States Capitol; (ii) an estimate of the total costs associated with replacement of 79 80 the Robert E. Lee statue, including the costs to design, construct, transport, and place the new statue, for the removal and transfer of the Robert E. Lee statue, and for any unveiling ceremony for the new 81 statue; and (iii) the name of the sculptor and the process used to select the sculptor. The report shall be 82 submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the 83 processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 84

85 § 10. In accordance with 2 U.S.C. § 2132, upon the selection of a prominent Virginia citizen and a

sculptor under § 5, the General Assembly shall request by memorializing resolution that the Joint
 Committee of Congress on the Library approve the request to replace the statue of Robert E. Lee and

88 that the Architect of the Capitol carry out the request. Upon adoption of the memorializing resolution by

the General Assembly and approval of the request in writing by the Governor, the memorializing
 resolution shall be submitted to the Joint Committee of Congress on the Library.
