10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 5 of Chapter 15 of Title 19.2 a
12	section numbered 19.2-266.4 as follows:
13	§ 19.2-266.4. Referrals to specialty dockets from other courts.
14	A. If a local specialty docket that has been established in accordance with the Rules of Supreme
15	Court of Virginia exists within a jurisdiction, any other court within that jurisdiction may refer any
16	defendant to such specialty docket provided that such defendant meets the criteria to be accepted into
17	such local specialty docket.
18	B. The court that has received such referral shall have jurisdiction over the defendant for any matter
19	that does not dispose of a charge or defense for the duration of the referral. Jurisdiction for
20	adjudication and all matters regarding the disposition of the case shall remain with the court making
21	the referral.
22	C. At the end of the referral or any other time necessary if the referral needs to be terminated, the
23	court that has received the referral shall enter an order making a recommendation for disposing the
24	matter, including any proposed findings of fact. Within 14 days after entry of such order, any party may
25	file specific written objections to the proposed findings and recommendations with the court making the
26	referral. Failure to object in accordance with this subsection waives a party's right to object to the
27	proposed findings. The referring court shall consider any objection to the proposed findings and
28 29	recommendations. The referring court may accept, reject, or modify the recommendation or receive further evidence as necessary

further evidence as necessary. D. Nothing contained in this section shall confer a right or an expectation for a defendant to be referred to a local specialty docket nor shall it be construed as a requirement for a local specialty docket to accept for participation every defendant.
