4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-298.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to teacher licensure; mental
5 6	health first aid.

10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-298.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12 13	§ 22.1-298.1. Regulations governing licensure.
13 14	A. As used in this section: "Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to
15	individuals who meet the criteria specified in the guidelines developed pursuant to subsection N or
16	regulations issued by the Board of Education.
17	"Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is
18	earned by successfully completing a Board of Education-approved industry certification examination,
19	being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an occupational
20	competency examination.
21 22	"Licensure by reciprocity" means a process used to issue a license to an individual coming into the Commonwealth from another state when that individual meets certain conditions specified in the Board
23	of Education's regulations.
24 24	"Professional teacher's assessment" means those tests mandated for licensure as prescribed by the
25	Board of Education.
26	"Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board of Education for a specified
27	period of time, not to exceed three years, to an individual who may be employed by a school division in
28	the Commonwealth and who generally meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's
29 30	regulations for licensure, but who may need to take additional coursework, pass additional assessments, or meet alternative evaluation standards to be fully licensed with a renewable license.
30 31	"Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board of Education for 10 years to an individual
32	who meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's regulations.
33	B. The Board of Education shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of
34	teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include procedures
35	for (i) the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure; (ii) written
36 37	reprimand of license holders, notice of which shall be made by the Superintendent of Public Instruction
37 38	to division superintendents or their designated representatives; and (iii) the immediate and thorough investigation by the division superintendent or his designee of any complaint alleging that a license
39	holder has engaged in conduct that may form the basis for the revocation of his license. At a minimum,
40	such procedures for investigations contained in such regulations shall require (a) the division
41	superintendent to petition for the revocation of the license upon completing such investigation and
42	finding that there is reasonable cause to believe that the license holder has engaged in conduct that
43	forms the basis for revocation of a license; (b) the school board to proceed to a hearing on such petition
44 45	for revocation within 90 days of the mailing of a copy of the petition to the license holder, unless the license holder requests the cancellation of his license in accordance with Board regulations; and (c) the
46	school board to provide a copy of the investigative file and such petition for revocation to the
47	Superintendent of Public Instruction at the time that the hearing is scheduled. The Board of Education
48	shall revoke the license of any person for whom it has received a notice of dismissal or resignation
49	pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, in the case of a person who is the subject of a founded
50	complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all rights to any administrative appeal provided by §
51	63.2-1526 have been exhausted. Regardless of the authority of any other agency of the Commonwealth
52 53	to approve educational programs, only the Board of Education shall have the authority to license teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, including those teachers employed to provide
55 54	nursing education.
55	The Board of Education shall prescribe by regulation the licensure requirements for teachers who
56	teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching
57	online courses. Teachers who hold a 10-year renewable license issued by the Board of Education may
58	teach online courses for which they are properly endorsed.

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59 C. The Board of Education's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking initial 60 licensure:

1. Demonstrate proficiency in the relevant content area, communication, literacy, and other core skills 61 62 for educators by achieving a qualifying score on professional assessments or meeting alternative 63 evaluation standards as prescribed by the Board;

2. Complete study in attention deficit disorder: 64

3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted 65 66 students; and

4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways 67 of increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school. 68 69

D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:

70 1. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have 71 not completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board of Education in consultation with the Department of 72 73 Social Services that are relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

74 2. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including 75 professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of a license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit 76 77 at an institution of higher education;

78 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of completion 79 of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall (i) be based on the current 80 national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 81 the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart 82 Association or the American Red Cross, and (ii) include hands-on practice of the skills necessary to 83 perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any 84 person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or 85 86 training;

87 4. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually 88 impaired shall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille;

89 5. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of 90 career and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the 91 teacher seeks endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained 92 an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the Board may, 93 upon request of the employing school division or educational agency, issue the teacher a provisional 94 license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential;

95 6. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training, provided by the Department of Education, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the 96 97 Board pursuant to regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia; 98 and

99 7. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement as a school 100 counselor shall complete training in the recognition of mental health disorder and behavioral distress, 101 including depression, trauma, violence, youth suicide, and substance abuse; and

102 8. Every person seeking initial licensure shall complete a Mental Health First Aid training or similar 103 program and every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete an online module on mental health developed or approved by the Department of Education. 104

E. No teacher who seeks a provisional license shall be required to meet any requirement set forth in 105 subdivision D 1, 3, or 6 as a condition of such licensure, but each such teacher shall complete each such 106 107 requirement during the first year of provisional licensure.

108 F. The Board shall issue a license to an individual seeking initial licensure who has not completed professional assessments as prescribed by the Board, if such individual (i) holds a provisional license 109 110 that will expire within three months; (ii) is employed by a school board; (iii) is recommended for licensure by the division superintendent; (iv) has attempted, unsuccessfully, to obtain a qualifying score 111 on the professional assessments as prescribed by the Board; (v) has received an evaluation rating of 112 113 proficient or above on the performance standards for each year of the provisional license, and such evaluation was conducted in a manner consistent with the Guidelines for Uniform Performance 114 Standards and Evaluation Criteria for Teachers, Principals, and Superintendents; and (vi) meets all other 115 116 requirements for initial licensure.

117 G. Each local school board or division superintendent may waive for any individual whom it seeks to employ as a career and technical education teacher and who is also seeking initial licensure or renewal 118 119 of a license with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education any applicable 120 requirement set forth in subsection C or subdivision D 2, 4, or 6.

121 H. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be 122 contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

123 I. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential 124 learning for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined 125 in Board regulations. Such alternate routes shall include eligibility for any individual to receive, 126 notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a renewable one-year license to teach in public 127 high schools in the Commonwealth if he has: 128

1. Received a graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education;

129 2. Completed at least 30 credit hours of teaching experience as an instructor at a regionally 130 accredited institution of higher education;

131 3. Received qualifying scores on the professional teacher's assessments prescribed by the Board, 132 including the communication and literacy assessment and the content-area assessment for the 133 endorsement sought; and 134

4. Met the requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3.

135 J. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance 136 of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 5 or to 137 any person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure 138 imposed by law and (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to 139 exceed three years, to any former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia 140 National Guard who has received an honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or 141 training but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license.

142 K. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

143 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching 144 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a 145 nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board of Education. The application for 146 such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not 147 require official student transcripts;

148 2. For any spouse of an active duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the 149 Commonwealth who has obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without 150 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the 151 Department of Education. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department of Education by 152 submitting a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts. No service 153 requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any such individual; and

154 3. For individuals who have obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without 155 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the 156 Department of Education. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department of Education by 157 submitting a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts. No service 158 requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any such individual.

159 L. The Board shall include in its regulations an alternate route to licensure for elementary education 160 preK-6 and an alternate route to licensure for special education general curriculum K-12. Each such 161 alternate route to licensure shall require individuals to (i) meet the qualifying scores on the content area assessment prescribed by the Board for the endorsements sought and (ii) complete an alternative 162 certification program that provides training in the pedagogy and methodology of the respective content 163 or special education areas prescribed by the Board. The curriculum of any such alternative certification 164 165 program shall be approved by the Board. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the Board from establishing other alternate routes to licensure. 166

167 M. The Board, in its regulations providing for licensure by reciprocity established pursuant to 168 subsection K, shall (i) permit applicants to submit third-party employment verification forms and (ii) 169 grant special consideration to individuals who have successfully completed a program offered by a 170 provider that is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation.

171 N. The Board shall develop guidelines that establish a process to permit a school board or any 172 organization sponsored by a school board to petition the Board for approval of an alternate route to 173 licensure that may be used to meet the requirements for a provisional or renewable license or any 174 endorsement. Any such alternate route may include alternatives to the regulatory requirements for 175 teacher preparation, including alternative professional assessments and coursework. The petitioner may 176 proffer or the Board may impose conditions in conjunction with the approval of such petition.

177 2. That the Department of Education, in collaboration with the Department of Behavioral Health 178 and Developmental Services, shall develop or approve one or more online modules on mental 179 health no later than November 30, 2020.
