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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 25 of Title 2.2 an article numbered
13	11, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2544 through 2.2-2549, as follows:
14	Article 11.
15	Virginia Revolutionary 250 Commission.
16	§ 2.2-2544. Virginia Revolutionary 250 Commission; purpose.
17 18	The Virginia Revolutionary 250 Commission (the Commission) is established as an advisory commission within the executive branch of state government.
19	The purpose of the Commission is to plan, develop, and perform programs and activities to
20	commemorate the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution, the Revolutionary War, and the
2 1	independence of the United States.
22	§ 2.2-2545. Membership; terms; quorum; meetings.
23	A. The Commission shall have a total membership of 24 members that shall consist of four
24	legislative members, 12 nonlegislative citizen members, and eight ex officio members. Members shall be
25	appointed as follows: (i) two members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules;
26	(ii) two members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in
27 28	accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; (iii) two nonlegislative citizen members who are members of a Virginia Indian Tribe to be
28 29	appointed by the Governor; and (iv) 10 nonlegislative citizen members, consisting of one representative
3 0	of the Virginia Museum of History & Culture, George Washington's Mount Vernon, Thomas Jefferson's
31	Monticello, James Madison's Montpelier, the American Battlefield Trust, the Colonial National
32	Historical Park, the Black History Museum & Cultural Center of Virginia, the Office of Historic
33	Alexandria, Preservation Virginia, and the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, to be appointed by the
34	Governor. The Secretary of Education, or his designee, and the directors of the following state agencies,
35	or their designees, shall serve as ex officio members with voting privileges: Gunston Hall, the Virginia
36	Tourism Corporation, the Library of Virginia, the Department of Historic Resources, the Frontier
37 38	Culture Museum of Virginia, Virginia Humanities, and the Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation. Nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be citizens of the Commonwealth.
38 39	B. Legislative members and ex officio members of the Commission shall serve terms coincident with
40	their terms of office. Nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for the duration of the
41	Commission's activities. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for
42	the unexpired terms. Legislative members may be reappointed. Vacancies shall be filled in the same
43	manner as the original appointments.
44	C. The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership. A
45	majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. Meetings of the Commission shall be held at the call
46 47	of the chairman or whenever the majority of the members so request.
47 48	§ 2.2-2546. Compensation; expenses. Legislative members of the Commission shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12.
49	Nonlegislative citizen members shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in
50	the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Compensation to members of
51	the General Assembly for attendance at official meetings of the Commission shall be paid by the offices
52	of the Clerk of the House of Delegates or Clerk of the Senate, as applicable. Reimbursement for the
53	reasonable and necessary expenses of nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be paid by
54	the Secretary of Education.
55 56	§ 2.2-2547. Powers and duties of the Commission.
56 57	The Commission shall have the power and duty to: 1. Formulate and implement a program for the inclusive observance of the 250th anniversary of the
57 58	independence of the United States and the Revolutionary War in Virginia, including (i) civic education
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59 concerning the ideals of the American Revolution and their contemporary relevance; (ii) visitation of 60 museums and historic sites, including battlefields; (iii) publication of historical documents and studies; 61 (iv) cooperation with agencies responsible for the preservation or restoration of historic sites, buildings, 62 art, and artifacts; (v) exhibitions and interpretive and wayfinding signage; (vi) improvement of museum 63 and educational facilities; (vii) arrangement of appropriate public ceremonies; (viii) development of a 64 comprehensive marketing and tourism campaign encompassing calendar year 2025 through calendar year 2026; and (ix) providing for the general dissemination of public information regarding Virginia's 65 involvement in the American Revolution; 66 2. Submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual report for publication as a report 67

document as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the **68** processing of legislative documents and reports. The chairman of the Commission shall submit to the 69 Governor and the General Assembly an annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Commission no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The 70 71 executive summary shall be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the 72 procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents 73 74 and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website;

3. Solicit, accept, use, and dispose of funds appropriated by the General Assembly and any gifts, grants, donations, bequests, or other funds received by the Commission for the purpose of aiding or 75 76 77 facilitating its work; and

78 4. Perform such other duties, functions, and activities as may be necessary to facilitate and 79 implement the objectives of the Commission. 80

§ 2.2-2548. Staffing.

The Virginia Museum of History & Culture and Gunston Hall shall provide staff support to the 81 Commission and coordinate all of its activities, including the activities of any committees of the 82 83 Commission. Every department, division, board, bureau, commission, authority, or political subdivision

84 of the Commonwealth shall cooperate with, and provide assistance to, the Commission, upon request.

85 § 2.2-2549. Sunset.

86 This chapter shall expire on July 1, 2027.
