9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 25.1-306 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 25.1-306. Notice of intent to file certificate.
12	The authorized condemnor shall, between 30 and 45 days prior to the date on which any certificate
13	will be filed or recorded pursuant to this chapter, give notice to the owner or tenant, if known, of the
14	freehold by certified or registered mail that such certificate will be filed or recorded with respect to such
15	person's property. Such notice shall contain the following language: "Between 30 and 45 days from the
16	date of this notice, a [certificate of take or certificate of deposit] will be recorded in the land records of
17	the circuit court," as appropriate. Such notice shall also state that upon recordation of the certificate,
18	the [ ownership of defeasible title to ] the property shall transfer to the condemnor and that the owner
19	has the right to petition the court [ to take possession for distribution ] of the funds represented by the
20	certificate, subject to any preexisting liens or other encumbrances upon the property. Additionally,
21	within four business days of the filing or recording of a certificate, the authorized condemnor shall give
22	notice of such filing or recording to the owner or tenant, if known, of the freehold by providing a copy
23	of such certificate by certified or registered mail.
