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11	WHEREAS, social workers form society's social safety net and offer important services to
12	individuals, families, groups, organizations, and the governmental agencies and political subdivisions of
13	the Commonwealth, guided by special knowledge of social resources and systems, human capabilities,
14	and the part that conscious and unconscious motivations play in determining human behavior; and
15	WHEREAS, social workers are trained to provide service and action to effect changes in human
16	behavior, emotional responses, and social conditions by the application of the values, principles,
17	methods, and procedures of the profession of social work; and
18	WHEREAS, social workers have demanding positions that entail increasing levels of required
19	paperwork, large caseloads, and consistent difficulties with challenging clients, including increased safety
20 21	risks; and WHEPEAS solaries of social workers are on everyon among the lowest of all convertions in the
<sup>21</sup> 22	WHEREAS, salaries of social workers are, on average, among the lowest of all occupations in the United States, especially among social workers with a master's degree; and
$\frac{22}{23}$	WHEREAS, workforce challenges facing the social work profession include high student loan debt,
<b>2</b> 4	lack of fair market compensation, translation of social work research to practice, social worker safety, a
25	lack of state-level licensure policies and reciprocity agreements for social workers providing services
26	across state lines and via telehealth, and a lack of diversity, all of which affect recruitment and retention
27	of social workers and lower the level of services provided to clients; and
28	WHEREAS, in order to continue the successful growth and development of citizens of the
29	Commonwealth through the practice of social work, it is essential that efforts be taken to ensure that an
30	adequate number of social workers are available to provide services and that social workers are
31	compensated in a manner that both rewards their work and encourages a long-term workforce; now,
32 33	therefore, be it <b>PESOLVED</b> by the Senate the House of Delegates concurring. That the Department of Health
33 34	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Department of Health Professions be requested to study the need for additional micro-level, mezzo-level, and macro-level
35	social workers and increased compensation of such social workers in the Commonwealth.
36	In conducting its study, the Department of Health Professions shall convene a work group, which
37	shall include representatives of the Virginia Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers,
38	institutions of higher education with social work programs, the Department of Social Services, and local
39	departments of social services. The work group shall (i) identify the number of social workers needed in
40	the Commonwealth to adequately serve the population; (ii) identify opportunities for the
41	Commonwealth's social work workforce to successfully serve and respond to increasing biopsychosocial
42 43	needs of individuals, groups, and communities in areas related to aging, child welfare, social services,
43 44	military and veterans affairs, criminal justice, juvenile justice, corrections, mental health, substance abuse treatment, and other health and social determinants; (iii) gather information about current social workers
45	in the Commonwealth related to level of education, school of social work attended, level of licensure,
46	job title and classification, years of experience, gender, employer, and compensation; (iv) analyze the
47	impact of compensation levels on social workers' job satisfaction and performance, as well as its impact
<b>48</b>	on the likelihood of other persons entering the profession and any complications to such compensation
49	levels caused by student debt; and (v) make recommendations for additional sources of funding to
50	adequately compensate social workers and increase the number of social workers in the Commonwealth.
51	The Department of Health Professions shall enter into data sharing agreements with the Department of
52 52	Social Services and other employers of social workers to enable the exchange of de-identified data
53 54	necessary to comply with the directives set forth in this paragraph. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of Health Professions
54 55	for this study, upon request.

The Department of Health Professions shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2020, and shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and 

- report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2021 Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 59 60
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
