Celebrating the life of the Honorable Willard James Moody, Sr. 4

5 6 WHEREAS, the Honorable Willard James Moody, Sr., an honorable veteran, distinguished attorney, 7 esteemed statesman, and beloved member of the Portsmouth community, died on March 27, 2019; and WHEREAS, a member of the "Greatest Generation," Willard Moody proudly served the United States Army in Europe during World War II; and 8

WHEREAS, upon his return, Willard Moody earned degrees from the Norfolk Division of The 10 College of William and Mary, now Old Dominion University, and the University of Richmond's School 11 12 of Law; and

WHEREAS, embarking upon a law career in 1952, Willard Moody would practice until the end of 13 14 his life and earn many honors and distinctions along the way; his legacy is The Moody Law Firm in 15 Portsmouth, which today is recognized as one of the nation's leading firms for injured railroad workers 16 and accident liability lawsuits; and

WHEREAS, serving as counsel for nearly every railroad workers union in the country, Willard 17 18 Moody earned a sterling reputation for his ability to win cases on behalf of his clients; in recognition of his success, he was inducted into the National Trial Lawyers Hall of Fame in 2014, the only Virginian 19 20 to have received this distinction; and

WHEREAS, as the Commissioner in Chancery and the Commissioner of Accounts for the 21 22 Portsmouth Circuit Court, Willard Moody contributed greatly to the proper and equitable administration 23 of justice in his community; and

24 WHEREAS, a born leader, Willard Moody served in the Virginia House of Delegates from 1956 to 25 1967 and in the Senate of Virginia from 1968 through 1984; over nearly three decades in public office, 26 he never lost an election; and

27 WHEREAS, during his tenure as a state lawmaker, Willard Moody introduced and supported many 28 important pieces of legislation to benefit all Virginians and offered his leadership and expertise to 29 several standing committees; and

30 WHEREAS, Willard Moody proved a steadfast supporter of the legal profession through membership 31 in several attorneys' associations, such as the Virginia Trial Lawyers Association, which he served as 32 president in 1973; and

33 WHEREAS, one of Willard Moody's proudest accomplishments in a remarkably illustrious life was 34 his establishment of the Railroad Museum of Virginia in his hometown of Portsmouth, a destination that 35 will promote greater interest in and understanding of railroads and trains for years to come; and

36 WHEREAS, inspired by his faith to serve others with compassion and humility, Willard Moody was 37 a member of Park View Baptist Church in Portsmouth, where he enjoyed fellowship and worship with 38 his community and taught Sunday school; and

39 WHEREAS, Willard Moody will be fondly remembered and dearly missed by his loving wife of 71 40 years, Betty; his children, Sharon, Willard, Jr., and Paul, and their families; and numerous other family members, friends, and colleagues on both sides of the aisle; now, therefore, be it 41

RESOLVED, That the Senate of Virginia hereby note with great sadness the loss of the Honorable 42 Willard James Moody, Sr., who had a profound and positive impact on countless lives as a veteran, 43 44 attorney, statesman, and friend; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for 45 presentation to the family of the Honorable Willard James Moody, Sr., as an expression of the Senate of 46 Virginia's respect for his memory. 47
