4. Title: Law-enforcement officers w/disability, former; vocational rehabilitation and employment services

5. Summary: The enrolled bill requires the Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services to make information regarding vocational rehabilitation programs and employment services available to former law-enforcement officers who have a disability as a result of their service. In addition, every law-enforcement agency in the Commonwealth must provide this information to law-enforcement officers who separate from their agency due to a disability resulting from their service.

7. Minimal Fiscal Impact

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Aging and Rehabilitative Services (DARS) assumes that existing rehabilitation and employment services materials can be updated and provided electronically to law enforcement agencies with minimal costs. Further, it is assumed that state law enforcement agencies would be able to provide the necessary information, as required by the bill, without any significant costs. The potential cost to local law enforcement cannot be determined at this time.
