**3. Committee:** Senate Judiciary

**4. Title:** Fingerprints and photographs by police authorities.

**5. Summary:** Provides that all duly constituted police authorities having the power of arrest may take the fingerprints and photographs of any person found in contempt or in violation of the terms or conditions of a suspended sentence or probation for a felony offense upon the order of a court. Current law permits the taking of fingerprints and photographs of: (i) any person arrested and charged with a felony or misdemeanor for an arrest that requires a report be made to the Central Criminal Records Exchange (CCRE); (ii) any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty after being charged by summons; or (iii) any person charged with a first offense that has been deferred by the court.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill adds to the list of cases in which law enforcement officers may take the fingerprints and photographs of a person to include persons who are found in contempt of court, or in violation of the terms or conditions of a suspended sentence or probation for a felony offense.

The Department of State Police (VSP) administers the CCRE, the central repository for criminal records in the Commonwealth. According to VSP, there is no anticipated fiscal impact on agency operations as a result of the provisions of this bill.

According to the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF), there is a minimal anticipated fiscal impact on agency operations for this bill. According to the Division of Capitol Police, any potential fiscal impact is indeterminate at this time. According to the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), any potential fiscal impact is expected to be minimal and can be absorbed by the agency's existing budget.

Any potential fiscal impact on other state or local law enforcement agencies is indeterminate at this time.
