4. Title: Walking tour permit

5. Summary: The substitute bill provides that any tour guide leading individuals on a walking tour to one or more establishments licensed to sell alcoholic beverages at retail for on-premises consumption may collect as one fee from tour participants (i) the licensee's fee for the alcoholic beverages served as part of the tour, (ii) the fee for any food offered as part of the tour, and (iii) the fee for the walking tour service.

The bill also requires the tour company to ensure that (a) each tour includes no more than 15 participants per tour guide and no more than three tour guides, (b) a tour guide is present with the participants throughout the duration of the tour, and (c) all participants are persons to whom alcoholic beverages may be lawfully sold.
