4. Title: Legal holidays; Election Day

5. Summary: Designates Election Day, the Tuesday after the first Monday in November, as a state holiday and removes Lee-Jackson Day as a state holiday.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed legislation is not expected to have a state fiscal impact, as the number of authorized state holidays would remain the same. The bill would reinstate Election Day as an authorized state holiday and would remove the existing holiday of Lee-Jackson Day. Election Day was a state holiday until 1989, when it was removed pursuant to Chapter 190, 1989 *Acts of Assembly*.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: All state agencies and localities.
