4. Title: Department of Criminal Justice Services; crisis intervention team training.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation adds the Department for Aging and Rehabilitation Services and brain injury stakeholders to the list of entities with whom the Department of Criminal Justice Services is required to consult in developing a training program for all persons involved in the crisis intervention team programs and requires the curriculum for such training program to include a module on brain injury

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final (see Item 8 below).

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) reports that the requirements of the proposed legislation are currently addressed in existing Crisis Intervention Team Training programs and in the training and curricula currently offered by the Department. Therefore, DCJS does not anticipate a fiscal impact as a result of the proposed legislation. Also, the Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services does not anticipate a fiscal impact as a result of the proposed legislation.

The engrossed version of the proposed legislation makes four hours of mandatory training in legal issues related to brain injuries part of a specified training module, as opposed to being in addition to such a training module.
