2. Patron: Sickles

3. Committee: Health, Welfare and Institutions

4. Title: Pharmacists; prescribing, dispensing, and administration of controlled substances.

5. Summary: Authorizes the prescribing, dispensing, and administration of certain controlled substances by a pharmacist, provided that such pharmacist prescribes, dispenses, or administers such controlled substances in accordance with a statewide protocol developed by the Board of Pharmacy in consultation with the Board of Medicine and set forth in regulations of the Board of Pharmacy. The bill clarifies that an accident and sickness insurance policy that provides reimbursement for a service that may be legally performed by a licensed pharmacist shall provide reimbursement for the prescribing, dispensing, or administration of controlled substances by a pharmacist when such prescribing, dispensing, or administration is in accordance with regulations of the Board of Pharmacy.

8. Fiscal Implications: The fiscal impact this bill would have on the Commonwealth cannot be determined. The Board of Pharmacy has no experience with complaints that may arise from limited prescriptive authority for pharmacists, therefore, the amount of complaints cannot be determined. This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Department of Medical Assistance Services or the State Corporation Commission.
