**2. Patron:** Kilgore

**3. Committee:** Passed Both Houses

**4. Title:** Electric utility regulation; energy efficiency programs; industrial customers.

**5. Summary:** Revises the definition of "large general service customer" from a customer with a verifiable history of demand from 500 kilowatts from a single meter of delivery to one with one megawatt at a single site. Certain large general service customers are exempt from the costs of certain energy efficiency programs. The measure requires the State Corporation Commission to allow a large general service customer to not participate in energy efficiency programs if such customer has implemented energy efficiency programs that have produced or will produce measured and verified results consistent with industry standards and other regulatory criteria. The measure requires the Commission to adopt regulations, by June 30, 2021, determining notification requirements and timing expectations, and requiring exempted customers to certify that its energy efficiency programs have delivered measured and verified savings within the prior five years. Savings from large general service customers shall be accounted for in utility reporting in the standards in § 56-596.2.
