**4. Title:** Coal ash ponds; drinking water well; resident notification.

**5. Summary:** Requires the owner or operator of any coal ash pond that is closed by capping in place, to complete a survey of all drinking water wells within one and a half miles of each of its ponds by October 1, 2020, and notify residents via mail and at least one newspaper of general circulation in the locality.
