4. Title: School principals; incident reports.

5. Summary: Eliminates the requirement for reports to be made to division superintendents and school principals on incidents involving assault or assault and battery, without bodily injury, of any person on a school bus, on school property, or at a school-sponsored activity. The bill also eliminates the requirement that school principals report (i) alcohol, marijuana, a controlled substance, an imitation controlled substance, or an anabolic steroid on a school bus, on school property, or at a school-sponsored activity, including the theft or attempted theft of student prescription medications and (ii) the assault and battery that results in bodily injury, of any person on a school bus, on school property, or at a school-sponsored activity; that may constitute a misdemeanor offense to law enforcement.
