3. Committee: Counties, Cities and Towns

4. Title: Removal of dangerous roadside conditions; local option.

5. Summary: Authorizes any locality, by ordinance, to require the owner of any property located within five feet of any public right-of-way to remove any and all trees, tree limbs, shrubs, high grass, or other substance that might dangerously obstruct the line of sight of a driver, be involved in a collision with a vehicle, or interfere with the safe operation of a vehicle.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: While this legislation would allow localities, by ordinance, to require property owners within five feet of any public right-of-way to remove any and all dangerous roadside vegetation, it also allows the locality to authorize those property owners to maintain such dangerous roadside vegetation as it exists until the vegetation is destroyed or removed. The provisions of this bill would apply to the state highway system. To the extent that such vegetation is allowed to encroach on rights-of-way of the state highway system, the Virginia Department of Transportation could incur additional, indeterminate costs in removing or working around encroaching vegetation.

11. Other Comments: This bill is similar to SB225.
