2. Patron: Carroll Foy

3. Committee: Education

4. Title: Public schools; enrollment; certain children placed in foster care.

5. Summary: Specifies, for the purpose of several provisions of law relating to the public school enrollment of children placed in foster care, that a child or student placed in foster care includes a pupil who was in foster care when he reached age 18 but such pupil has not yet reached age 22.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill would expand the pool of students for which foster care reimbursements can be claimed under Direct Aid to Public Education. Additionally, the increase in eligible foster care students would produce a similar increase in average daily membership. The number of additional students and any additional resulting state cost are indeterminate at this time, as is the fiscal impact to local school divisions.
