**4. Title:** Family day homes; storage of firearms.

**5. Summary:** Requires that during the hours of operation of a family day home, all firearms be stored unloaded in a locked container, compartment, or cabinet and that ammunition be stored in a separate locked container, compartment, or cabinet. Additionally, this bill would allow local ordinances regulating the possession and storage of firearms, ammunition, or components or combination thereof at child-care facilities to be more extensive in scope than comparable state statutes or regulation that apply to family day homes.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This legislation will not expand the Department's legal authority or service population. Likewise, it will not impact the Department's programs or services. Similar regulations already exist regarding storage of firearms and ammunition in family day homes regulated by the Department of Social Services.
