5.	<b>Summary:</b> Authorizes the State Water Control Board to issue special orders for violations to persons constructing or operating any natural gas transmission pipeline greater than 36 inches inside diameter. An order issued pursuant to the bill may include a civil penalty of up to \$50,000 per violation, not to exceed \$500,000 per order. The Board may assess a penalty if the person has been issued at least two written notices of alleged violation by the Department					

of Environmental Quality (DEQ) for violations involving the same pipeline; if such

is a finding that such violation occurred after a hearing was conducted.

Any potential revenue impact resulting from this measure is indeterminate, as it is not possible to forecast the number of violations that will occur.
