**4. Title:** Public schools; Mental health awareness training.

**5. Summary:** Requires each school board to adopt and implement policies that require each teacher and other relevant personnel, as determined by the school board, employed on a full-time basis, to complete a mental health awareness training or similar program. The bill requires each school board to provide such training and provides that a school board may contract with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, a community services board, a behavioral health authority, a nonprofit organization, or other certified trainer to provide such training. The bill provides that such training may be provided via an online module.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** There is no anticipated state expenditure impact resulting from the provisions of this bill. The Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS) may experience an indeterminate revenue impact if local school divisions contract with DBHDS to provide this training. Any fiscal impact to local school divisions is indeterminate.
