**4. Title:** Postrelease incarceration of felons sentenced for certain offenses.

**5. Summary:** Under current law, offenders who are convicted of knowingly failing to register or reregister with, or knowingly providing materially false information to, the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry are subject to added terms of postrelease supervision by the Department of Corrections. This bill removes the phrase “by the Department of Corrections,” leaving other requirements for post release supervision intact.
