**4. Title:** Health insurance; coverage for fertility preservation procedures for cancer patients.

**5. Summary:** Requires health insurance policies, subscription contracts, and health care plans to provide coverage for standard fertility preservation procedures that are medically necessary to preserve the fertility of a covered individual due to the covered individual's receiving cancer treatment that may directly or indirectly cause iatrogenic infertility.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** No fiscal impact on the State Corporation Commission. The Department of Human Resource Management notes an impact on the State Health Insurance Plan. See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** None on the State Corporation Commission. The Department of Human Resource Management estimates the fiscal impact of House Bill 776 on the State Health Plan at "\$1.2 million based upon 2.5% of cancer patients projected to utilize cryopreservation."
